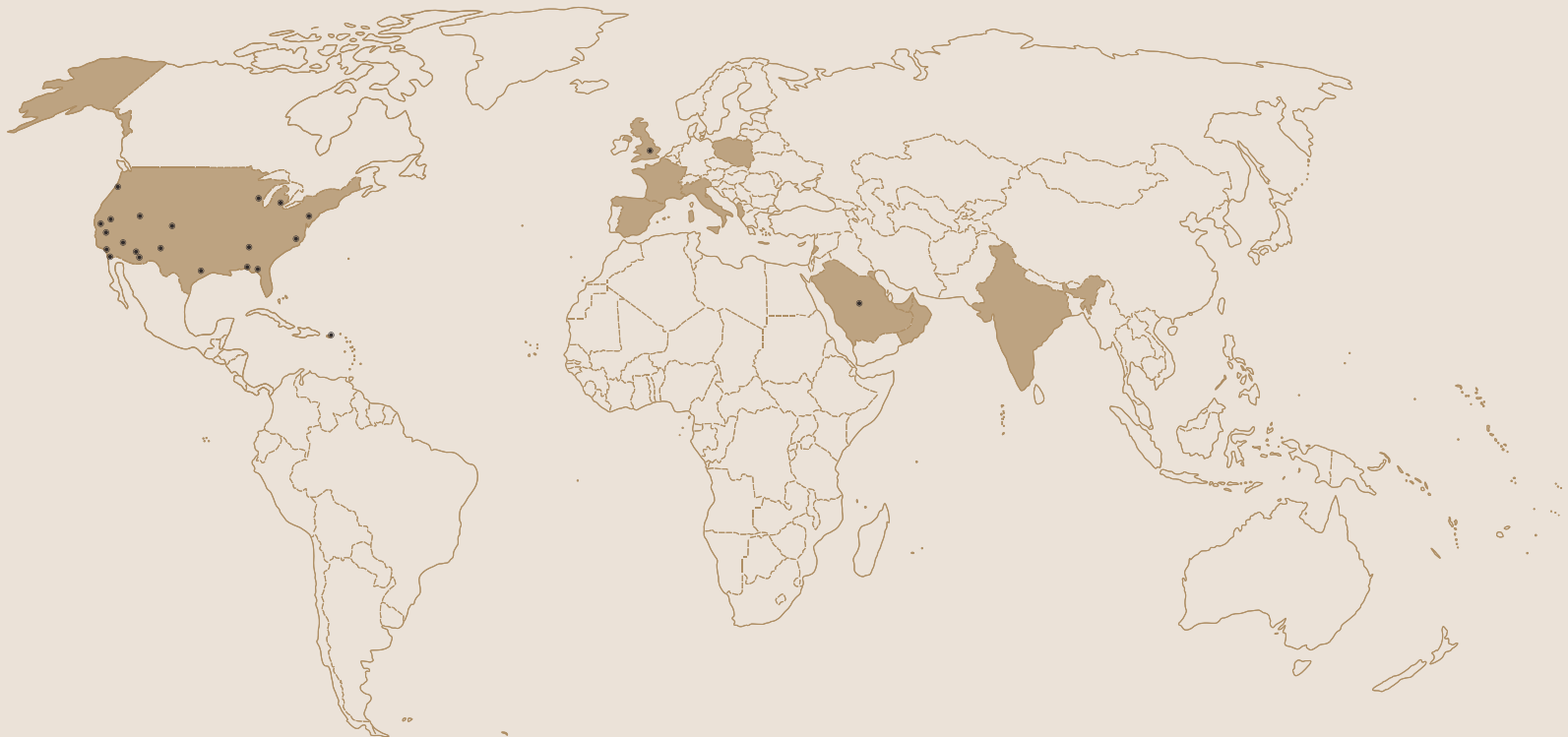

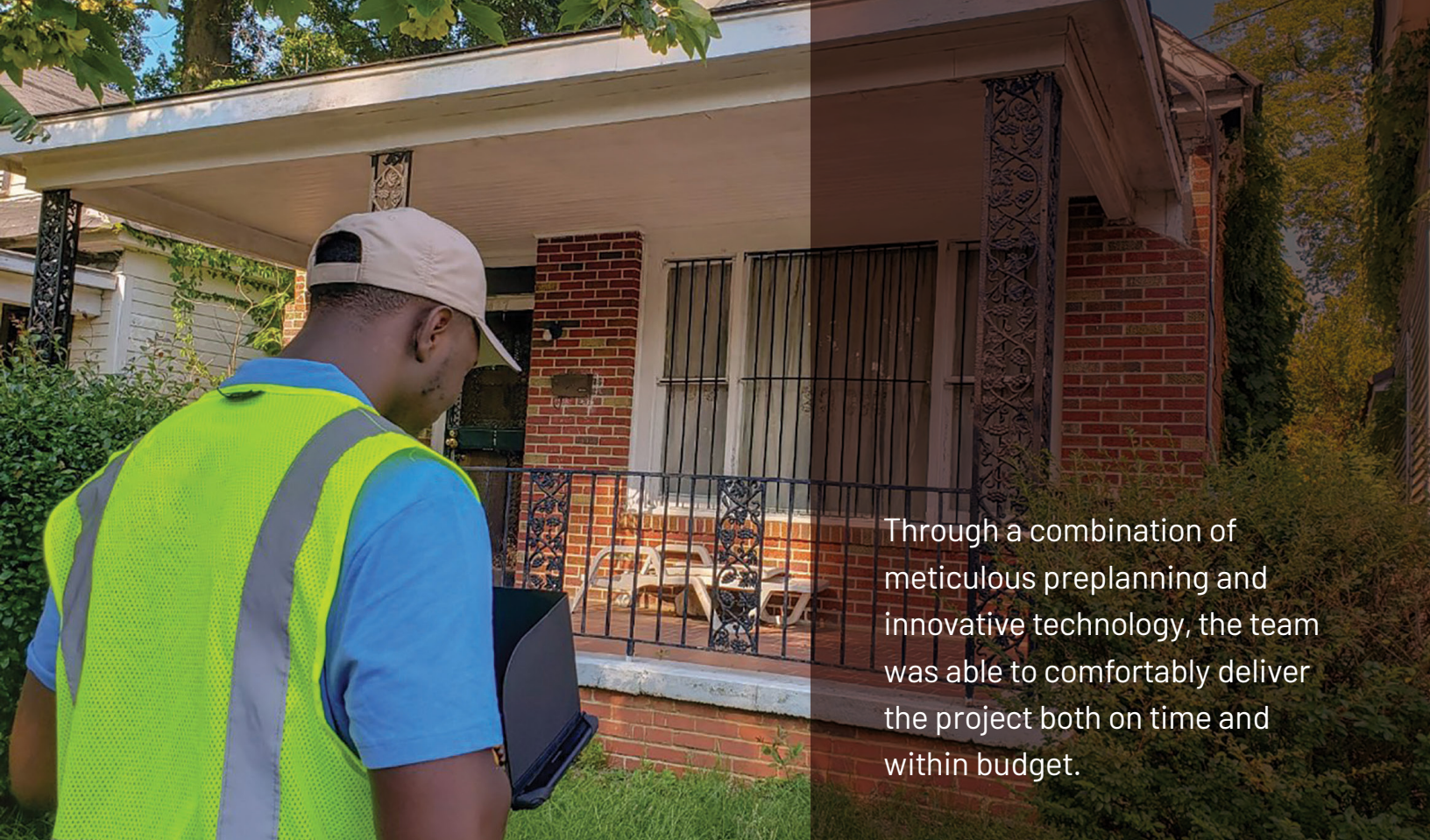

PROJECT HIGHLIGHTS

MAPPING MONTGOMERY AND ITS ROLE IN THE MODERN CIVIL RIGHTS MOVEMENT

City of Montgomery, Alabama

Hired by the City of Montgomery, Alabama, Chronicle Heritage documented over 2,300 buildings in historically African American neighborhoods where the Civil Rights Movement was born. As a follow-up public interpretation project, we developed an ESRI "StoryMap" to showcase over 20 significant sites from our survey. The StoryMap provides an accessible and interactive way to digitally explore the sites, bringing each StoryPoint to life with historical photographs, videos, and scans of documents.

From the start, we were proud to be part of a project that would help bring lasting recognition to a City whose history was critical to the advancement of Civil Rights in our country. While recording so many buildings was daunting, we made sure we were well-equipped to execute the project.

To ensure this was delivered to the highest possible standard, we took extra care when preplanning the project, which allowed us to streamline the fieldwork. We equipped our field workers with the latest technology to ensure they were both efficient and precise in the work they carried out. Each site, building, and structure would need to be photographed and have key architectural and historic information documented, all while walking the streets by foot, moving from one building to the next, over the course of a month.

The final documents provided to the City and, ultimately, the NPS, were approved and now form the foundation for future preservation work in Montgomery. The project stands as the largest survey of its kind in the City.

PROJECT HIGHLIGHTS

HISTORIC STRUCTURE REPORT AND CULTURAL LANDSCAPE REPORT

Oñate Crossing, Hart's Mills,
Old Fort Bliss, Texas

Chronicle Heritage is developing a detailed study of an internationally significant site on the United States-Mexico border. The site, which is the location where Don Juan de Oñate crossed the Rio Grande in 1598 establishing El Camino Real de Tierra Adentro, became an important river crossing on the road. It was subsequently settled by mission Indians before becoming a flour mill and residence in the 1850s. A portion of the site was also a military installation in the 1880s and hosted military encampments during the Mexican Revolution. The residence associated with the flour mill and three fort buildings remain intact on the cultural landscape.

Chronicle Heritage is developing a detailed landscape and building history for the site which includes archival research, and detailed depictions of the buildings and landscape over time.

Chronicle Heritage is working with the BLM in creating reports summarizing the history of seventeen Alaska waterbody groups to assist in making formal determinations of navigability for title purposes.



PROJECT HIGHLIGHTS

ALASKA NAVIGABILITY STUDIES

Chronicle Heritage historians are currently researching, analyzing, and summarizing the history of use of 17 Alaska waterbody groups (over 95 rivers and lakes) before and until statehood. The navigability histories require extensive background research, including the review of BLM and other related Federal records, the examination of materials held in local Alaska libraries, historical societies, archival collections and similar repositories, and the analysis of digital collections held online.

Research results are incorporated into summary reports that provide a general context of use, type of watercraft used, location of use, and earliest and last dates of use. The reports, which are designed to assist the BLM in making formal determinations of navigability for title purposes, also address commercial use within the broad context of general use.

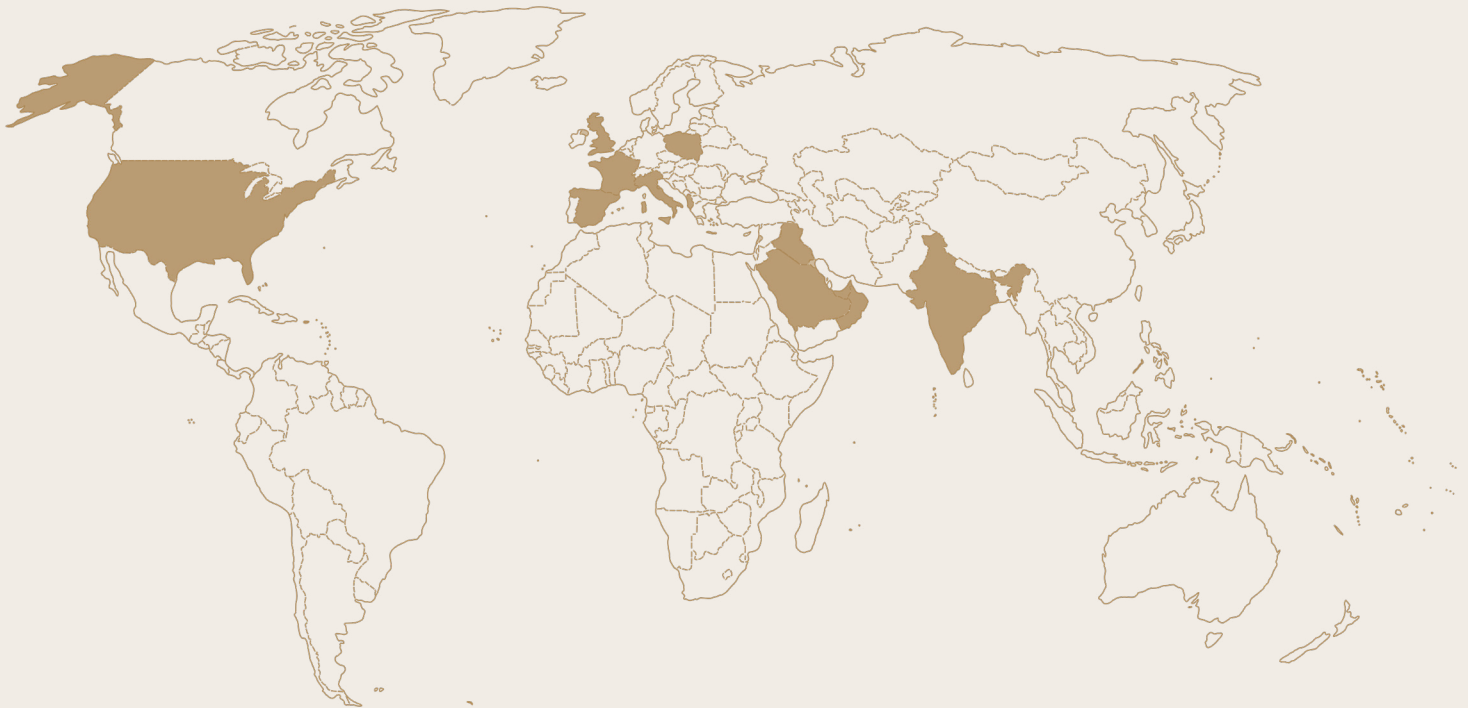
